## PASTOR'S NOTE

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Spring always brings about some interesting weather conditions. Last month we caught a little glimpse of spring and then we saw snow falling another time. The weather gives us all something to start conversations with, to talk about for hours on end. The weather is often a common place to start conversations and a place to end conversations. It is a safe topic to talk about because everyone experiences the weather in some way or another. A shared experience of the weather, or anything else, gives us a connection to each other and our surrounding community.

The disciples in the upper room certainly had a shared experience when Jesus appeared to them after being raised from the dead. We can only imagine what their conversations must have been like as they talked about their thoughts and feelings of seeing Jesus risen from the dead. Acts 2:42 talks about the community that is formed by the disciples and those whom have a shared experience of Jesus.

It's not just the disciples in the Bible who had a shared community experience in Jesus. All of us as Christians also have a shared experience in Jesus. And as a community of Christians, we can go beyond talking about the weather with one another. We can go deeper. We can talk about and share the things that really matter.

We as a congregation, we as a community of Christians bear witness to what is really important. We are living out our faith through our actions by gathering together on Sundays to worship our risen Lord, and we can also talk with others about what is really important in our lives – Jesus Christ.

How does the community in Christ grow (that is growing deeper spiritually)? It grows by telling the story of what God has done. It grows by being refreshed and renewed in the deep study of God's Word. It grows by prayer and worshipping together. It grows by giving, helping and sharing with others. These are the basics of the shared community in Christ. All are invited to come and share in the Easter experience of our risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

# EDUCATION

## **ADULT EDUCATION – STUDY ON SEXUALITY** **Class held Sunday mornings between services of worship**

In April we will continue our conversation about sexuality and the ELCA's position on ordination and marriage for persons who are gay or lesbian. In order to better understand the different views that are present within the larger church, we are taking a look at different scripture passages and the different interpretations of those passages.

For our conversation and discussion we adopt the ground rules of being respectful of different views, people's experiences and what people share. Any dialogue about sexuality is bound to be sensitive. Differences regarding the topic of homosexuality are often very sharp and conversations at times have often become hurtful to all parties involved. Therefore, the starting point for these conversations will be the recognition that there are faithful people of God on both sides of these issues, who love God and are trying to do their best to determine what God has to say.

Some people have asked if following this study we will be taking a vote regarding whether or not Good Shepherd will support marrying persons who are gay or lesbian. I would like to emphasize that this adult education study is the beginning of a conversation. The ELCA started a formal conversation on the topic of sexuality back in 1989. In 2001 the churchwide assembly mandated that the church conduct two studies on sexuality and bring recommendation back to the church wide assembly in 2005. The church very intentionally set aside four years for study, prayer, and conversation. It is my understanding that Good Shepherd did not participate in those four years of study, and we are only now beginning the process of study, prayer, and conversation. I personally do not feel a vote is wise or necessary at this time. We can discuss this more the last week of our study on sexuality.


