## PASTOR'S NOTE

### Waiting for Resurrection

Dear partners in ministry

On Palm Sunday, in Confirmation, during Sunday School, and in 1<sup>st</sup> communion instruction, we often take time to talk about and review the events of Holy Week.

We start with Palm Sunday when Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people shout, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" From there we go to Maundy Thursday. We talk about how Jesus and his disciples gathered together to celebrate the Passover, and how Jesus gave new meaning to the bread and wine, giving us his body and blood in this meal for the forgiveness of our sins, life, and salvation. We go on to discuss the events that happen after the meal: praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, Judas' betrayal of Jesus, Jesus' arrest, Peter's denial of Jesus and Jesus being put on trial. Then we move to Good Friday and talk about Jesus' death on the cross. When I'm teaching, I then like to ask the question, "So, what happened the next day?"

Invariably someone will say Jesus rose from the dead, and I'll explain, "no, not yet." It's interesting how we would like to jump to Easter. We perhaps see this desire in the difference in church attendance numbers from Good Friday to Easter Sunday. After all, we don't like to stay in those times that make us uncomfortable. We want to jump to the good news. We want Easter and resurrection.

Again, I'll ask, "So what happened on Saturday?" After a few more guesses, I let them know that it's a trick question because for the most part nothing happened. God's people were waiting.

Waiting is hard. Waiting feels like it takes forever, and yet, much of our lives we end up waiting on something or someone. After a LONG winter, we're waiting for spring. Students are waiting for summer. High school seniors are waiting for graduation. Many college seniors and graduates are waiting for a job offer. We wait for test results. We wait for someone to call. We wait for someone to show up. We wait to save enough. We wait.

As much as we don't like the waiting, God is still at work. Even in the tomb. Even in the darkness. Even in the waiting God is at work.

One of my seminary professors told our class that it was a good thing that Jesus didn't rise from the dead immediately because sometimes we have to wait.

And we wait.

But we do not wait forever.

What happens next? It's Easter! Jesus is alive! Life has come from death! And that changes everything. Jesus' resurrection reveals to us that God's desire is for life for all of us and for this world, and God will do anything and everything to make that happen. Right now we experience glimpses of this abundant life that God desires for us, but for the most part we wait. We wait in hope knowing that because Jesus lives, we too shall live, and we too shall have the fullness of life God wants for us.

## MARCH SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION

### **Adult Education: Study on Sexuality -- Class held Sunday mornings between services of worship**

In March we will continue our conversation about sexuality and the ELCA's position on ordination and marriage for persons who are gay or lesbian. In order to better understand the different views that are present within the larger church, we are taking a look at different scripture passages and the different interpretations of those passages.

For our conversation and discussion we adopt the ground rules of being respectful of different views, people's experiences and what people share. Any dialogue about sexuality is bound to be sensitive. Differences regarding the topic of homosexuality are often very sharp and conversations at times have often become hurtful to all parties involved. Therefore, the starting point for these conversations will be the recognition that there are faithful people of God on both sides of these issues, who love God and are trying to do their best to determine what God has to say.

Some people have asked if following this study we will be taking a vote regarding whether or not Good Shepherd will support marrying persons who are gay or lesbian. I would like to emphasize that this adult education study is the beginning of a conversation. The ELCA started a formal conversation on the topic of sexuality back in 1989. In 2001 the churchwide assembly mandated that the church conduct two studies on sexuality and bring recommendation back to the churchwide assembly in 2005. The church very intentionally set aside four years for study, prayer, and conversation. It is my understanding that Good Shepherd did not participate in those four years of study, and we are only now beginning the process of study, prayer, and conversation. I personally do not feel a vote is wise or necessary at this time. We can discuss this more the last week of our study on sexuality.

### **FIRST COMMUNION TRAINING OFFERED**

Part of our living as God's people is sharing in the meal that we call the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion. During Lent we will be offering First Communion instruction for all children in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and above, with children receiving their first communion on Maundy Thursday, March 24<sup>th</sup> at the 7:00 pm service.

Like Baptism, Holy Communion is a gift of God's grace. There is nothing we can do to earn or deserve either sacrament. Holy communion is a sacred meal in which we receive Christ's body and blood in the bread and the wine. All children planning to receive their first communion are asked to attend one of the following instruction classes. Our hope is for each student to be accompanied by a parent or another caring adult to share in this learning with their child.

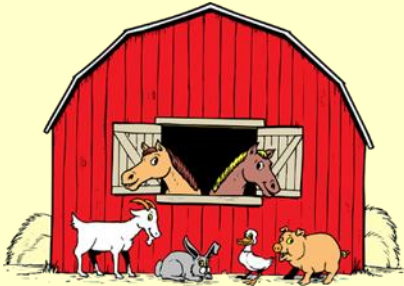

We encourage parents and children to be in conversation and pray about whether or not their child is ready to receive this sacrament.

Students participating in First Communion Preparation are invited to **receive their First Communion at the Maundy Thursday Worship service at 7:00 PM, March 24.** This is an evening that families have often invited grandparents, baptismal sponsors, and other family members to participate in too. The second Sunday of every month we collect a NOISY OFFERING. This noisy offering is given to a designated charity. Our March noisy offering is always specified to go to the Plainview-Elgin Area Food Shelf. the ELCA Malaria

Cash/Check donations are the best way to contribute to the Food Shelf because of the access the Food Shelf has to distribution programs that allow them TREMENDOUS buying power with your cash donations; however, food items will not be turned away. If you are able to help, please write out an extra check, made out to Good Shepherd and place it in the offering plate in addition to your regular offering. Note "food shelf" on the memo. At the end of the March, Good Shepherd will forward one check to the PEM Food Shelf to help with their March Campaign. Along with March's noisy offering, the Lenten offerings will also be directed to the Food Shelf.

### **"THE 40 CAN CHALLENGE"**

The Plainview Knights of Columbus have issued a friendly challenge, "The 40 Can Challenge", to the area churches and businesses to collect cans of food for the area food shelf. For every 1000 pounds of cans donated they will give \$100 to the school backpack program. You are invited to bring your cans of food to church. We will be in need of someone who can load the cans in their truck and get them weighed at the elevator (they'll weigh the truck empty and then loaded). The 40 Can Challenge will take place over the time of Lent.
