# CONGREGATIONAL NEWS

## **BUILDING RENOVATION AND EXPANSION UPDATE - NOV. 2016**

In September the Council met with architect David Kane. New design plans are now on display in the Gathering Space for everyone to see.

During September and October's council meeting, Council discussed the General Contractor position. While Knutson was originally awarded this position over three years ago, Knutson graciously released Good Shepherd from this commitment. This provided the Council with the opportunity to review the advantages and disadvantages of going with Knutson, while also inviting KBS to make a presentation to the Council at the October council meeting.

Following the KBS presentation and further discussion, the Council decided to choose to work with KBS. This decision now allows the architect and KBS to talk in order to be able to move forward on design plans and towards getting an estimate of cost. Unlike the process of building a house, a general contractor is needed to work with the architect in finalizing design plans and then biddable plans. Consequently there is no cost estimate available until after the architect and general contractor have worked together. At this time, we are now waiting for David Kane and KBS to come back to us with more finalized design plans.

Based on the time frame given us, it is our hope to have these plans and cost estimates in January for the congregation.

Regardless of the size of our donation, it was a Great feeling to know we were giving every week. It strengthened our relationship with God and Good Shepherd.

**The truth is, We Need Your Help, Your Commitment.** As you all may have noticed, we have plans to expand our Church and that is going to take a huge commitment from all of us as members. But aside from the big plans for the building, we do so much more at Good Shepherd. We give to so many organizations, groups, and people in need and in the end, that is what Generosity is all about...helping those in need.
