## PASTOR'S NOTE

In a recent sermon, I shared the following:

*Approached by a group of young people who wanted to know what it meant to be a Catholic, Archbishop Rembert Weakland replied:*

*"Go to mass every Sunday, and work in a soup kitchen every week for six months. Then you'll know what it means to be a Catholic."*

*He told these young people to commit themselves to a regular discipline, sticking to it whether they felt like it or not. He invited them to immerse themselves in those God-shaped and God-shaping activities that were central to the faith. This is how they would know what it meant to be a Catholic.*

The above quote touches on how the process of **belonging** leads to **behaving** which then leads to **believing**.

A number of years ago, at a wedding, I ended up talking to a parent (not a member of the congregation I was serving) who thanked me for the nice service and proceeded to explain how he was going to let his daughter (ten at the time, I think) choose her own religion. When I asked how he was helping his daughter to do that, he proceeded to tell me about what he was not doing. Essentially, he was not exposing her to any religion. My heart went out to this young girl, because faith doesn't happen in a vacuum. None of us, one day, all on our own, wake up and decide "this is what I'm going to believe."

Faith comes from belonging to a community, and that in turn leads to certain behaviors, and from those behaviors faith develops. Many of the children and youth ministries here at Good Shepherd incorporate this type of process. Recently 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students who are part of our faith community each received a Bible. The next weeks they came together and practiced opening up the Bible, reading from the Bible and finding Bible passages. This practice of Bible reading will continue through their time in Sunday School.

The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students belonging to our faith community have started confirmation. Each week they gather together as part of the faith community and also members of a confirmation small group. As a result of being part of the confirmation faith community, certain behaviors are asked of these young people. They are asked to attend classes, go to worship, and participate in service projects. After doing these things for two years, they are invited to publicly affirm their baptism, sharing with the congregation "this is what I believe."


Regardless of age, all of us need to be a part of a faith community (belonging); we need to participate in the activities of the faith community where God is calling us and/or where God has given us gifts to participate (behaving), and through all of this we are strengthened in our faith (believing).

# CONGREGATION NEWS

## UPDATE ON RENOVATION AND EXPANSION PLANS

Architect David Kane met with the Council in September and presented a first draft of a design plan incorporating the recommendations that came from the congregation and were reviewed by the Exploratory Committee and the Church Council. The following is the first draft of the design plan:



A larger drawing of the design plan can be found on a tripod at the church entrance.

As indicated in the design drawing, the A/V equipment area has been removed from the sanctuary, the square footage of the kitchen has increased, an extraneous hallway into the offices has been eliminated for better flow, and the storage area in the Fellowship Center has been moved to the far side to provide for better flow from the Gathering Space into the Fellowship Center.

The next steps in this process include making a decision on a general contractor. Once a general contractor is selected, the design plan will be reviewed once again for any changes and initial building decisions regarding materials, etc. will need to be made. All of this will lead us closer to getting estimates on cost.

## SUNDAY MORNING ADULT EDUCATION:

During the month of October the Adult Education class on Sunday mornings will meet between services in the Youth Room. We will continue our study on the Religion of Islam.
